Plant of the Evening -Schoenorchis micrantha

The winner is a delightful miniature vandaceous orchid not commonly seen in shows and monthly benching in the Sydney area. The plant is mounted on a small piece of tree fern hanging down with 11 inflorescences (photo

Rather attractive terete leaves scatter along a highly branched stem, 3-6 cm x 2.5 mm, green or nearly purplish in some. As a progressive bloomer in the beginning of this flowering season, only three of the inflorescences bear fully open flowers on the night.

The flowers are small (about 1mm long), tubular and open at the tip forming a tiny star with attractive off-white colouration (photo 2). Flowering will continue until end of August.

It is a tropical orchid found in north-eastern Queensland from Iron Range to Tully River at altitude 0-400 m. The orchid also occurs in Indonesia. New Caledonia, New Guinea, the Solomon Islands and Vanuatu.

Photo 2 (J Klepetko) In the natural habitat, it is found growing on trunks of tropical rainforest trees in an environment of high light, high rainfall and high humidity.

According to Mike (Michael Harrison - Macquarie Native chids - Editor), he has had the plant since 1987 and so judging by the size, it is a rather slow grower. In the Sydney area, the plant has to be grown under heated conditions and so it has been grown in a heated ventilated glasshouse with minimum of 15 Deg. C. It is hung high up in the glasshouse, receiving plenty of sunlight and during winter months, watered once a week on sunny days.

Pennant Hills Market Place Display and Sales Table - Saturday 27 August

This year ANOS Sydney Group is again holding a one day Display at Pennant Hills Market Place - on Saturday 27th Aug. The event was very successful last year with many members of the public taking interest and talking to members about orchids. The display provides a fantastic chance to showcase ANOS Sydney Group to the public, promote native orchids and their culture, and attract new members. A sales table will also be available - possibly located outside the front of the Centre near Harris Farm Markets.

Banna Group, who operate the Centre, have kindly offered to provide 4 tables, so set-up and pull-down will be easy. Members are encouraged to display plants in flower and bring plants to sell at the event. The aim of the display is to be eyecatching and a talking point for the public, and consequently plants in the display need not be perfect or award quality!

Note: Due to the limited availability of last year's site, the location of the display area this year has changed. The new location is inside, next to the Amcal Pharmacy, and is a much smaller area than we had last year (approximately only 2 tables long). 2 people should be sufficient to man the Display area at any one time (note: seating is limited).

Details:

Display and Sales times: Setup will start after 7:00am. Pull down will be at 4pm. Display plants ideally should arrive early in the morning, or by 9am at the latest. Sales plants can be brought in at any time during the day. Please clearly label any sale plants with the price and your initials. (A sales commission of 15% will go to ANOS Sydney Group).

Location: Pennant Hills Market Place is located at 4-10 Hillcrest Road, Pennant Hills, just off Pennant Hills Road and only 100 metres from Pennant Hills Station.

Access: Access is via Ramsay and Hillcrest Roads which are both off Yarrara Road. Yarrara Road joins Pennant Hills Road just before the pedestrian overpass if you are heading east (towards Hornsby) on Pennant Hills Road.

Parking: Parking is available on site in car parks outside, underneath and near the centre.

It's the Time of Year to Watch your Spikes!

Members are reminded to be especially vigilant in keeping an eye out for pests during this critical time of spike and bud development in order to minimise damage and prevent further infestation. Common pests that damage spikes and flower buds include slugs, snails, caterpillars and aphids.

Ideally for most success, controls should be applied prior to any damage occurring. This requires pre-emptive application of suitable deterrents or pesticides. Slugs, snails, caterpillars, aphids and similar pests are generally easy to address. However, more insidious pests like moth larvae which can burrow into flowers, buds and developing

spikes (which are becoming more prevalent) are best addressed at their most susceptible life cycle stages, such as the adult (moth) or egg stage.

Advice on suitable treatments for less common or other specific pests is best sought from experts on orchid/plant pests. Remember in order to protect yourself and others, pesticides should be used with appropriate caution and protective clothing, and in accordance with the manufactures instructions on the label.

Rare and Beautiful Orchids (Tall Tales but Very True!)

It was the weekend after Ted's Speciosum show (Ted and Winsome Walmsley A.N.O.S. Mid-North Coast Group - Editor), On

the Friday night, my wife Anna decided on all the jobs I was going to do for the weekend, then she was going to visit her friend and check on her mother. But as luck would have it, some bushwalking friends on their way back from Kempsey came to stay for the weekend. We decided to visit some of my old sacred orchid bush locations.

After a 30 min drive on a rugged bush trail bouncing our heads on the roof of our Hilux, we got to our destination, we thought. I announced to friends "We are finally here, this is the place". On inspection though, I realised we were only in the vicinity. I was on the wrong track! It's hard to remember thirty years ago. Murmuring under their breaths (jokingly I think), "Where are all the orchids you said were here, we have come all this way and the Bush Basher has let us down!". The area was a perfect rocky environment for orchids, rock dwelling *Dendrobiums* and other terrestrials. It was strange, we ventured from the car looked over the escarpment and there was...nothing! I swear to God 30 years ago, these rocks were covered in them. This was embarrassing.

I was not going to give up though, so I scrambled down the bottom of the 40 meter rock face and looked up. To my astonishment, there were hundreds if not thousands of *Den. kingianum* and many other types of orchids everywhere
